PTFA Playground Revamp

Work will begin on the playground renovations in September. We can't wait to see phase 1 completed in the first half term of the school year.



Alongside the PTFA's considerable investment we have also financed new playground equipment to use in the revamped areas and storage for this. A rota of ball games will be set up for September including netball, hockey, football, basketball, dodgeball, with year groups having time each week on the 'ball court' to encourage inclusive play for everyone in school.

Parent Pay Accounts

Please ensure your parent pay account for 2018-19 is settled as soon as possible. This will include paying outstanding dinner money and music tuition payments.

Whilst contributions for visits are voluntary, please understand that if the cost is not covered by voluntary contributions then school has had to make up the shortfall from the school funds which means using money that would support the children in other ways.

With several visits only having 50% of the costs covered this may leave us in the position of cancelling visits. To help us with this, please ensure your child's Parent Pay account is kept up to date and payment is made prior to the visit taking place.

Lost property will be on display Tuesday and Wednesday. Anything not claimed by Wednesday night will be given to charity.

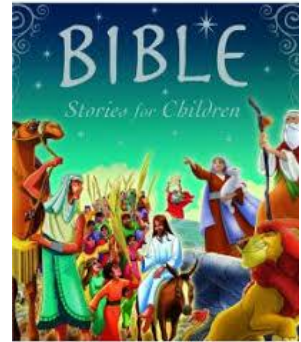
A final lost property table with items from the beach trip will be outside of school on Friday morning.

Each week the whole school takes part in a 'Open the Book' assembly where we listen to stories from the Bible and consider the messages that these tell. The children love the weekly assemblies which are taken by volunteers from our local churches.

We recently had a visitor into one of our assemblies, who is the Open the Book Area coordinator. Here is his feedback to the team who deliver the stories to us at Archibald...

- *The children greeted the staff, said hello and waved as they came into assembly. This is obviously a sign of the great relationship your team has built up with the children at Archibald.*
- *The pupil helpers were clearly enjoying themselves.*
- *The children relayed that they enjoyed the Open the Book stories in assembly. They said, "Teachers are always reading stories to us but this is much better!"*
- *The children were able to recall many of the stories they have listened to which is a testimony to the power of Open the Book storytelling and the performances.*
- *With 300 children in the hall, I could see that the whole audience gave the story their rapt attention throughout.*
- *The relationship between the school and the team is enhanced by the fact that you work there and Andrew visits in his own capacity as youth worker.*



We look forward to continuing our work with the Open the Book team in 2019-20.
